Take Action if Your Carbon

Monoxide (CO) Detector Beeps

- Take immediate action if your CO detector sounds, or if you have headaches, fatigue, dizziness, shortness of breath, nausea, and/ or confusion.
- Get fresh air immediately. Call your local fire department and move everyone outdoors into fresh air.
- Do not re-enter the building until it has been inspected and declared safe.



This is a good time to check the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) detectors. Or switch to a plug-in style smoke/CO detector.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services reports 500 people in the state are treated in the emergency room for carbon monoxide poisoning annually.

It's a colorless, odorless gas. Exposure symptoms include a headache, fatigue, dizziness, shortness of breath, nausea, and confusion.
